The Ontario Nonprofit Network (ONN) seeks an insightful policy specialist to join our core team. The Funding Reform Policy Lead we seek will work collaboratively with ONN and the Ministry of Citizenship & Immigration (MCI), specializing in policy research, analysis, and communications related to the issue of funding reform in Ontario, as outlined by the 2012 Open for Business process. They will be skilled in government relations, policy development and project management and will be passionate about Ontario's nonprofit sector.

Who Are We?

ONN is a network incubated by the Centre for Social Innovation (CSI) that works to communicate, coordinate and collaborate with nonprofit organizations working for the public benefit in Ontario. ONN works strategically to respond to policy, legislation, issues and practices that affect Ontario's 46,000+ nonprofit organizations.

What Will the Funding Reform Policy Lead do?

Managed jointly by ONN and MCI, they will be responsible for being the content lead on the issue of funding reform, through research, analysis, writing and relationship building. They will support the Joint Funding Reform Steering Committee and related working and task groups. They will liaise and consult with the Ontario government, and consult and convene the voices of the nonprofit sector on this issue. They will be an advisor to ONN's Policy Team.

What Is Required To Apply?

- Senior level management and leadership experience in the nonprofit and government sectors and/or strategic consulting experience
- Demonstrated skills of research, analysis, and strategic/critical thinking
- Excellent written and oral communication skills
- Experience with, and knowledge of, Ontario's nonprofit sector as well as network/association environments
- Project management experience and ability to plan and carry out complex assignments within tight deadlines
- Post secondary/graduate level experience in public policy, nonprofit management or related field
